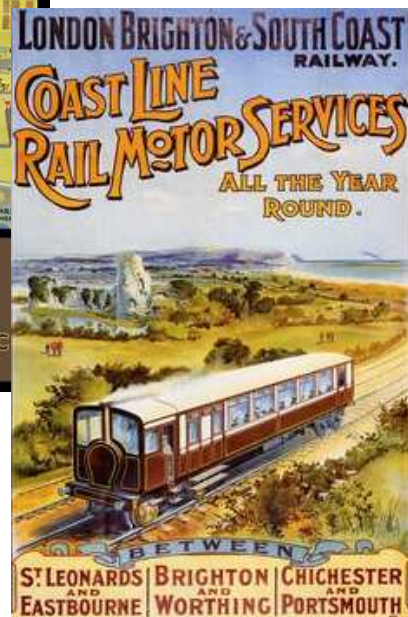
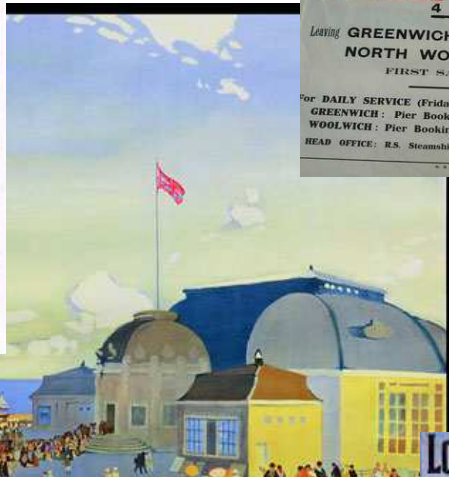
## Read the Factsheet: The Age of the Paddle Steamer

The Worthing Belle Paddle Steamer operated between Worthing and Brighton Piers from 1899 until the outbreak of World War I in 1914.

Design your own poster to advertise the 1913-1914 daily steam paddle service from Worthing to Brighton Pier.

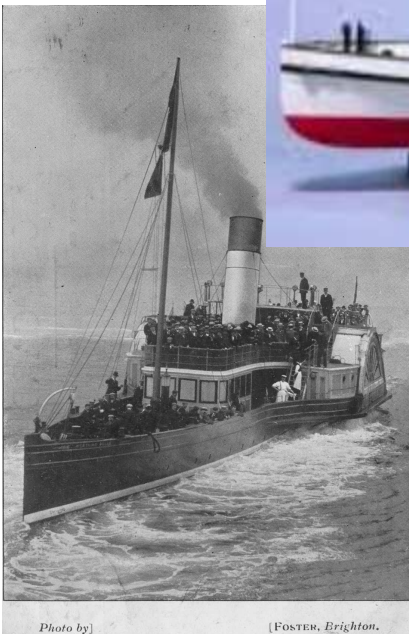


## Activity 2: Design a 3-D model of the Worthing Belle

- Daily Timetable
- World War I Wartime Service
- What happened to the vessel after the war?
