

Top Town singers in Pier show

THE six Roberts Brothers and the two Davison Brothers, whose close harmony singing helped Worthing to reach the final round of last year's Top Town television contest, are to appear at the Pier Pavilion next month in Worthing Corporation's Easter variety show.



Another Top Town finalist in the show will be conjurer Robert Sinclair, a brilliant member of the Leeds team which defeated Worthing in the final at Manchester. The show will open on Easter Monday for a six-day run.

Those likeable little showmen, Paul and Alan Davison, are waiting only for 15-year-old Alan to leave school at Easter in order to become full-time professional artists. They have already been signed up for a resident summer show by Bernard Delfont.

How fitting that their first professional engagement should be here in Worthing, the town which put these two Bognor schoolboys on the entertainments map on the strength of their being active members of Worthing Boys Club.

Their success on television opened up for them a promising career as recording artists, their first record, "Seven Days a Week," becoming a hit with the public. This week they made their second record, "Haven't Got a Girl," a song written for them by Eric Boswell, author of that cele-brated Christmas carol, "Little Donkey."
